- 1 More than 80 of the state's 740-plus wineries, a half-dozen breweries, and four craft distilleries call Woodinville home.
- 2 Downtown Seattle, the Space Needle, and Pike Place Market are just 12 miles from Bellevue.
- 3 Redmond's 640-acre Marymoor Park has a 40-acre off-leash area, a bird watching trail, the state's only velodrome, and access to Burke-Gilman Trail and Sammamish Slough.
- 4 Kirkland, about five miles north of Bellevue on Lake Washington, teems with waterfront parks, boutiques, and restaurants.
- 5 Picturesque Snoqualmie Falls is 30 minutes away, while hiking and skiing are within an hour east of Bellevue at Snoqualmie Pass.
- 6 Mount Rainier National Park, with two visitor centers, hiking, and snowshoeing, is roughly two hours south of downtown Bellevue.

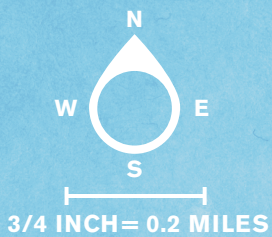

- 1 The Bellevue Collection—encompassing Lincoln Square, Bellevue Square, and Bellevue Place—features 230-plus shopping and entertainment destinations.
- 2 The Shops at the Bravern is home to high-end and luxury shopping.
- 3 Old Bellevue—on Main Street—features independent boutiques, locally owned restaurants, and galleries.
- 4 The 20-acre Downtown Park has a half-mile walking loop and a cascading water feature that ends in a reflecting pool.
- 5 Meydenbauer Beach Park, on Lake Washington, has a fishing dock, picnic area, and a sandy swimming beach.
- 6 The performing and visual arts are on display year-round at Meydenbauer Center and Bellevue Arts Museum.
